

# YEAR IN REVIEW 2020-21 Reopening the Garde


### Year in Review 2020-21

In March 2020, the Garde faced an uncertain future as it struggled to protect the theater and serve the community during the pandemic, in preparation for the theater's eventual opening. Here are the highlights of that challenging time.

#### MAKING THE GARDE SAFE

With support from generous donors, the Garde was protected with these improvements

- Installed touchless restroom fixtures
- Provided touchless hand sanitizers in the lobby
- Increased filtration of air ventilation to MERV 14
- Installed UV-lights inside lobby HVAC systems
- Installed backstage UV-light air purifiers
- Installed new HVAC system with Merv 13 filtration for storefront classroom
- New safety railings in the balcony and stairways

## A closed theater opens itself to those in need

#### We provided safe spaces for a variety of community needs

- · The national book launch of resident writer Jeff Benedict's NY Times bestseller "The Dynasty"
- Hosted The Arc Eastern Connecticut's 5th Annual Film Festival fundraiser which included high-quality award-winning films about people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD)
- Premiered the documentary film "Those People", the story of the New London Talent Show, produced by The Day and Curtis Goodwin (Best Documentary, Mystic Film Festival)
- Received 100,000 donated masks from the Rossi Group
- The Garde lobbies, Oasis Room, and storefronts housed classrooms for the Interdistrict School for Arts and Communication (ISAAC) middle school and the City of New London public schools
- Provided rehearsal space for the New London Community Orchestra
- Use the Garde marguee as a voice of the community in big bold letters
- Partnered in promoting the New London Census
- Opened a new satellite bookstore of Bank Square Books, Title IX, in the Garde cottage
- Provided a home for The Writer's Block InK, a non-profit organization that encourages youth to use writing and performance as tools to address personal and social challenges
- Helped found CT Performing Arts Center Coalition, a new state-wide alliance of the six urban-based major performing arts centers: The Garde, The Bushnell (Hartford), Place (Stamford), Palace (Waterbury), Shubert (New Haven), and the Warner (Torrington). Together we have worked together to raise funds for the arts and reopen our theaters!
